About Equal Pay Day 2023

Equal Pay Day is a global event to raise awareness of the gender pay gap. It marks how many months into 2023 the average woman must work to catch up to what the average man earned in 2022. fairontario.ca

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This Equal Pay Day, Say No to Privatization.

- Privatization refers to the transfer of public services and work to the private sector. It leads to cutbacks in public services, and shifts us to for-pay and for-profit services.
- **Privatization dismantles and undermines our most valuable resources:** health care, education, child care, community and social services.
- Privatization can mean lower wages for women workers, reduced health benefits, no pension coverage, more precarious jobs, and fewer workplace rights. Privatization eliminates good jobs for women and intensifies the gender pay gap.
- When public services are diminished and delivered for profit, women can't afford to pay. Women are forced to fill in the gaps in delivering health and social care for their families and communities.
- Privatization increases the gendered burden of unpaid work.

to do it: have a conversation in your workplace, host a gender pay gap lunch & learn, coordinate calls to your MPP to talk about how privatization hurts women, or plan a Tweet storm!

5. Wear Red and take a photo to protest how the gender pay gap puts women in "the red". Post it on social media with the hashtags #EqualPayDay, #PrivatizationHurtsWomen, and #CloseThePayGap
